I want to thank all of those that have volunteered this past year. With out you we would not be the post that we are. I can not express to you how much you make us look good.



His most outstanding accomplishments should include, after arriving in the States from China as a 12-year-old in 1960, becoming a naturalized citizen in 1963. He's earned college degrees (bachelor's and master's) in business administration and management. Moreover, he has held a multiplicity of important positions in the Legion, government, and private industry. It would be hard to dream up a more ideal package of education, skills, and experience than that possessed by National Commander Wong.

As I typed this column, I thought about my tour of China some years ago. At one point, my late wife and I were strolling along the Bund, a popular, waterside walkway in Shanghai. Notwithstanding the Bund's long history of foreign business activity, it seemed as if we were the only white folks on the crowded stretch of concrete. 8ozs cheddar cheese


Roll in walnuts
