

Meet One of our Members

Sometimes we don't know all of our Members, or know them vaguely. Over the next few months lets take a closer look at some of them and in the process discover a few interesting things about them.

James Stinekraus, known as 'Jim', can often be seen with his family down at American Legion Post 129. Were you aware he is a member of the Carson's Raiders? WWII, The United States Marines decided to make a new team, the "Elite of the Elite" were the raiders group. In total, there was only Four Raiders Groups. Jim was one of the "Elite of the Elite".

Carlson's Raiders fought in Guadalcanal, however, they are better known for the raid on Makin Island in the Gilbert islands. Via submarines, the Raiders (122 Marines) were dropped off on the Japanese control island. Their mission was to assault the Japanese troops to keep them busy so they could not reinforce the troops currently under assault by Americans on Guadalcanal island. The Americans lost 30 men during this raid. The raid took place on August 17, 1942.



STAND DOWN FOR HOMELESS VETERANS (September 28, 2013)

Donations of Toiletries, socks and under clothing are appreciated. We will have a box available in the Auxiliary Office to place any items that you would like to bring in. This year we will be working together with the entire 5th District to assist in distributing these items to our Homeless Veterans.

Stand Downs are one part of the Department of Veterans Affairs efforts to provide services to homeless veterans. Stand Downs are typically one to three day events providing services to homeless Veterans such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings, VA and Social Security benefits counseling and referrals to a variety of other necessary services such as housing, employment

and substance abuse treatment. Stand Downs are collaborative events coordinated between local Vas, other government agencies and community agencies who serve the homeless.

The first Stand Down was organized in 1988 by a group of Vietnam Veterns in San Diego. Since then Stand Downs have been used as an effective tool in reaching out to homeless Veterans.

Approximately 1/3 of homeless adults (one out of every 3) in this country are veterans, yet veterans represent only 11% of the civilian population. On any given night 107,000—300,000 veterans are homeless. Based on various estimates

500,000—840,000 veterans are homeless at some time during the year. It has been estimated that Iraq & Afghanistan veterans represent 1.8% of the homeless veteran population. In 2008 44% of those surveyed reported being homeless for the first time. According to the Department of Veterans Affairs the number of homeless Vietnam era veterans exceeds the number of fatalities that occurred during the war.

The Florida Dept. of Children & Families has estimated that 17.3—18.4% of Florida's homeless are veterans. In 2008 the number of homeless veterans in Florida on any given night was19,000.
