On January 24, we will host a golf tournament to benefit Girls/Boys State.



The Boys and Girls State programs are nonpartisan and teach young men and women responsible citizenship, and love for God and Country. The participants are exposed to the rights and privileges, the duties and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. The training is objective and practical with city, county, and state governments operated by students elected to the various offices. Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, and assemblies.

Boys State began in 1935 and Girls State began two years later. High school boys and girls who have completed their junior year, spend an intensive week of study working together as self-governing citizens in our state capital. All their expenses for this week are covered by local Posts and Units. Two boys and two girls are then selected to represent their state

in Boys and Girls Nation at our capitol in Washington, D.C.

Both Post 129 and Unit 129 have been honored by having our delegates chosen to represent us for this week. The candidates are chosen from the top students who excel in GPA, sports, community service, and other school activities. Post 129 and Squadron 129 send eight boys to Tallahassee, and Unit 129 sends five girls. The majority of our representatives come from our beaches and Ducan U. Fletcher High School.

The American Legion family is focused on service to veterans, active service members and communities. We are a patriotic organization devoted to mutual helpfulness which is committed to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs in our communities.

We honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families both at home and abroad.
