It gives you an overview of the 82,444 miles we traveled over the last year, along with our 14,663 volunteer hours and +\$20,000 in collected donations. With the election being completed, I would like to welcome our new officers: Alec Finley as Assistant Director, Chuck Nist as Sergeant-At-Arms, and Wayne Parrott as the Assistant Sergeant-At-Arms. I would also like to thank our Treasurer Bob Schlatter, Secretary Bill Wilson, Safety Officer Phillip Leveridge, Road Captain Bobby Greer, Chaplain Kathy Jewell, Historian JoAnn Blik and Memberhship Chair Mary Tarnowski for continuing in their positions.

Another thing our Post Riders were heavily involved in was last year's Merry-Go-Round fundraiser for the "Children and Youth" picnic at Post 117. The state ALR organized a state-wide competition between all 17 districts. The competition was based on miles ridden, hours, new members, and donations. I'm proud to announce that our 5th District won the competition and we were presented with the trophy at this year's convention.

One of the topics during the convention that I wanted to pass on is our overall

performance of your State Riders Family. With just 71% of the rider organizations reporting, we accumulated over 2,161,117 miles, 223,088 volunteer hours and collected \$566,697 in donations.

I know that I reported that we collected about \$34,000 during the State Legacy Run. During the convention, we collected another \$35,000 for a total of \$79,000. There have also been some changes in the scholarship program. In the past, the children of a deceased Veteran after 9/11 were eligible for the funding. They have now changed it to include "wounded warriors" children.
