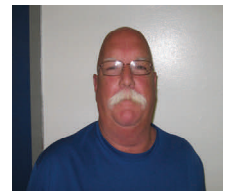
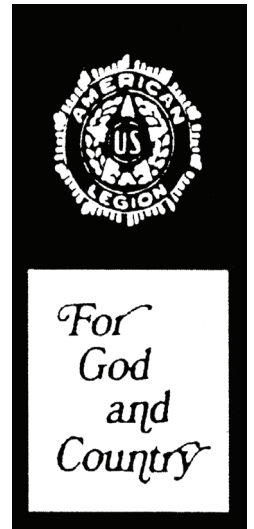

# American Legion Riders

Ok, you are most likely getting tired of me talking about the State Legacy Run. Well, you're going to have to read just one more article about it. Now it's time to talk about the 2015 experience.

As I've state before, it all started at Post 57 in Lake City. We stopped at 36 Posts carrying our message of support for the Scholarship Fund designed to help children of fallen veterans since 9/11. Based on some of the numbers, there are over 14,000 children that will fall under the guidelines of this program; an estimated 2,500 have taken advantage of the program so far.

One example of what we experienced during the run, one of the couples stopped at a gas station in Panama

City. During the process of servicing their bike, a gentleman walked up and started asking what the ride was about. After they shared our story, he dug around in his pockets and pulled out a dollar and gave it to us for the fund. Turned out he was a homeless veteran, but insisted and would not let us give him the dollar back.

The American Legion/VFW Post in Port Saint Joe share facilities, and between the two organizations, they donated \$3,000 to the program. They also have connections with the Independence Fund, a program sponsored by Bill O'Reilly on Fox News. They donated \$10,000 to support the Legacy Fund.

These are just a few examples of what I experienced on the run. This is what brings you back every year. There were seven riders from the 5th District, and four of them were from Post 129: Bobby Greer, Wayne Parrott, Chris Chinery, and myself. I believe it's something that everyone should experience just once. If not all of it, at least the last stop. We rolled into Crystal River with over 130 bikes. What an experience!

Please remember Bike Night is Saturday, May 2, and our next ALR meeting is Saturday, May 16. Officer nominations are still open for the May meeting.

## Memorial Day [\(usmemorialday.org\)](http://usmemorialday.org)

“Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in service of the United States of America. Over two dozen cities and towns claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day. While Waterloo, NY, was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966, it’s difficult to prove conclusively the origins of the day.

Regardless of the exact date or location or its origins, one thing is clear — Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War and a desire to honor our dead. It was officially proclaimed on 5 May 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, in his General Order No. 11. “The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land,” he proclaimed. The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn’t the anniversary of any particular battle.

On the first Decoration Day, General Games Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there.

The first state to officially recognize the holiday was New York in 1873. By 1890 it was recognized by all of the northern states. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting any war).

It is now observed in almost every state on the last Monday in May with Congressional passage of the National Holiday Act of 1971 (P.L. 90 - 363). This helped ensure a three day weekend for Federal holidays, though several southern states have an additional separate day for honoring the Confederate war dead; January 19th in Texas; April 26th in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and Mississippi; May 10th in South Carolina; and June 3rd (Jefferson Davis’ birthday) in Louisiana and Tennessee.

### Red Poppies

In 1915, inspired by the poem “in Flanders Fields,” Moina Michael replied with her own poem:

We cherish too, the Poppy red  
That grows on fields where valor led,  
It seems to signal to the skies  
That blood of heroes never dies

She then conceived of an idea to wear red poppies on Memorial Day in honor of those who died serving the nation during war. She was the first to wear one, and sold poppies to her friends and co-workers with the money going to benefit servicemen in need. Later a Madam Guerin from France was visiting the United States and learned of this new custom started by Ms. Michael. When she returned to France she made artificial red poppies to raise money for war orphaned children and widowed women. This tradition spread to other countries. In 1921, the Franco-American Children’s League sold poppies nationally to benefit war orphans of France and Belgium. The League disbanded a year later and

and Madam Guerin approached the VFW for help.

Shortly before Memorial Day in 1922 the VFW became the first veterans’ organization to nationally sell poppies. Two year later their “Buddy” Poppy program was selling artificial poppies made by disabled veterans. In 1948 the US Post Office honored Ms. Michael for her role in founding the National Poppy movement by issuing a red 3 cent postage stamp with her likeness on it.”

American Flags should be flown at half-staff from dawn until noon local time.

Over 200 volunteers place flags at each grave site at Jacksonville National Cemetery on the Saturday before Memorial Day. Anyone can volunteer to help place the flags.
