We have adopted two charities this year, first is "Heroes on the Water." The proceeds from our October poker run will help support their annual operating budget. The second charity is Hart Felt Ministries. They presently have eight veterans' homes that in need of repair. We have already furnished the money for material purchases to facilitate repairs to two of the homes.

"Hart Felt Ministries" is a straight forward charity with a focus on our older populations, which many are veterans or veteran's widows. They have a network of several different contractors with a mix of skills, and several church organizations that donate their free time to help the individuals or families with their needs.

"Heroes on the Water" has a focus on our younger veterans. HOW was founded in 2007 and helps our Nations warriors and veterans from all branches of the United States military unwind using therapeutic qualities of fishing from kayaks. Their unique kayak fishing program allows

participants a chance to decompress from the stress associated with combat, and the physical rigors of rehabilitation. Warriors enjoy these benefits while on guided fishing trips held in local communities around the country. What looks like a day trip of paddling and fishing is in fact something much deeper and long lasting.

The "Heroes on the Water" program is unique in that it is a long-term activity, not a one-time event. They believe that the effectiveness of the program is a direct result of engaging the wounded military personnel for the long-term. HOW has served over 23,800 warriors and families members. Please come and join us on October 8 and help support this charity.

In an effort to try and accommodate more members, we are going to try some date changes to see if this is something that will help increase attendance at our meetings. Member participation is greatly needed to be successful in supporting our charities.


