The Post is over 100% membership and we are seeing new faces in the canteen. We have done a lot to be recognized as a partner in the community and I would like to keep this going next year.


We have worked together to make things happen, and become stronger.




--If you do some terrible things during training, you could be boot-ed out of the Navy.
